  - Transit
- Fiscally Unconstrained Project List
- Plan Completion Cost Estimates
  - \$5.5 billion



# Major Accomplishments of 2005 Solano CTP

- Alternative Modes - Completed
  1. Davis-Dixon Class II bike connection, and extension of the Dixon-Vacaville route to Hawkins Road.
  2. Class I Central County bikeway in Suisun City
  3. McGary Road from Red Top Road to Lynch Canyon
  4. Rose Drive overcrossing of I-780 in Benicia.
  5. Wilson Avenue multi-use path along the Mare Island Strait in Vallejo
  6. Class I bike path on the new Benicia-Martinez Bridge to the Benicia bicycle path network
  7. Nine TLC Planning Grants totaling \$265,000
  8. Five TLC Capital projects, funded by \$4.4 million in grant funds



# Major Accomplishments of 2005 Solano CTP

- Arterials, Highways and Freeways
  1. I-80/680/780 Corridor Improvements
    - HOV lane from Red Top Road to Airbase Parkway
  2. Widen SR 37 to 4 lanes through Vallejo
  3. SR 12 Jameson Canyon Safety Projects
  4. SR 12 Safety Projects
  5. Jepson Parkway initiation
  6. Suisun Valley Parkway
  7. Corridor Plans for I-80, SR 113 and SR 12




# Major Accomplishments of 2005 Solano CTP

- Transit
  1. SolTrans JPA
  2. Vacaville Intermodal Transportation Center
  3. Fairfield Vacaville Train Station
  4. 1,600 Park and Ride and Transit parking spaces
  5. Transit Corridor Plans, CBTPs, SRTP covering the county



# New Solano CTP

- Maintains Three Core Elements
  - Active Transportation
    - Includes alternative fuels strategy
  - Arterials, Highways and Freeways
  - Transit and Rideshare
- Adds a Land Use Chapter
- Priority Projects identified in specific plans such as bicycle and corridor plans
  - Project list and priorities identified by cities and advisory committees form the backbone of the new Solano CTP
  - Fiscally unconstrained for non-priority projects



# How Do We Reach the Community?

- Active Transportation
  - Citizen and Staff-based advisory committees developed specific plans that provided most content for Active Transportation Element
    - BAC, PAC, SR2S, SR2T, Alt Fuels, TAC
- Arterials, Highways and Freeways; and, Transit and Rideshare
  - Advisory Committees
    - InterCity Transit Consortium, PCC, Seniors and Persons with Disabilities
  - Direct Public Outreach
  - Focus Groups
